

## ANTLERLESS TAG EXPLANATION FOR 2024-2025 HUNTING SEASON

Tyndall Air Force Base has been approved to receive Antlerless Deer Tags for the 2024-2025 hunting season. The addition of these tags will allow hunters to harvest antlerless deer (deer without antlers or with antlers less than 5 inches in length) throughout the entire hunting season. You will not have to wait until “doe weekends” to harvest antlerless deer. With the addition of these tags comes some changes to harvesting antlerless deer on Tyndall. These changes are detailed below.

- **ALL** antlerless deer **MUST** be tagged with an antlerless tag going forward, including during the archery/crossbow season and “doe weekends.”
- Hunters wishing to harvest an antlerless deer **MUST** grab an antlerless tag from the check station before heading to your stand/blind. If you do not grab an antlerless tag, you **CANNOT** harvest an antlerless deer during your hunt. Each hunter may only receive one tag at a time, and they will be issued on a first-come, first-served basis.
- All antlerless deer harvested **MUST** be tagged with the antlerless tag received from the check station before moving from the field. This is **IN ADDITION TO** reporting the harvest to FWC’s harvest reporting system within 24 hours.
- All antlerless deer harvested with an antlerless tag count towards your Tyndall Hunt Program and Florida bag limit. They are not bonus tags.
- Unsuccessful hunters who have received an antlerless tag **MUST** return the tag upon checking out at the Hunter Check Station.
- Each hunter may only harvest two antlerless deer on Tyndall during the 2024-2025 season in accordance with the Tyndall Hunting Regulations.
- Hunters who harvest an antlerless deer without first receiving an antlerless tag from the check station will have their deer confiscated and their hunting permit revoked for the remainder of the 2024-2025 hunting season.
- If all antlerless tags are filled, no more antlerless deer shall be harvested on Tyndall for the remainder of the season.
